

ENROLLMENTS IN ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION

Submitted for: Information.

Summary: This report summarizes 12-month headcount enrollment and preliminary fall term 2000 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments for Illinois colleges and universities. Final fall term headcount enrollments, aggregated by student characteristics such as gender, racial/ethnic group, class level, and declared major, are obtained during the winter and are published each spring in the *Data Book on Illinois Higher Education*.

Preliminary fall term enrollment data show that statewide enrollment has remained steady, increasing by .6 percent, to 739,143 students in fall 2000. Enrollment increased slightly at independent institutions in fall 2000, and dropped slightly at community colleges and public universities.

Over 1.1 million persons enrolled in Illinois colleges and universities during fiscal year 1999. This reflects the total number of persons enrolled in coursework during the entire fiscal year.

ENROLLMENTS IN ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION

This report summarizes preliminary fall term 2000 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments for Illinois colleges and universities, and 12-month unduplicated headcount enrollment for 1999. Final fall term headcount enrollments, aggregated by student characteristics such as gender, racial/ethnic group, class level, and declared major, are obtained during the winter and are published each spring in the *Data Book on Illinois Higher Education*. Fall term enrollments provide a snapshot of Illinois higher education enrollments on the 10th day of the fall term. Unduplicated headcount enrollment illustrates the number of individuals who attend colleges and universities over the course of the full year.

Fall 2000 Enrollments

Fall 2000 preliminary headcount enrollments at 186 institutions total 739,143 representing an increase of 0.6 percent from fall 1999. Headcount and FTE enrollment for each Illinois college and university for fall terms 1999 and 2000 are attached. The headcount enrollment by sector for the last six fall terms is shown below.

Public universities reported a preliminary headcount enrollment increase of 16 (0.0 percent) between fall 1999 and 2000 while public community colleges reported a headcount decrease of 290 (-0.1 percent). Independent institutions reported a headcount increase of 4,379 (2.2 percent). Institutions in the independent sector are subdivided into two general categories in the attached detailed report of institutional enrollments. The category "Independent Not-For-Profit Institutions" includes those not-for-profit institutions offering liberal arts curricula or a variety of courses of study along with professional, theological, fine arts, and technical institutions. Enrollments in degree-granting proprietary institutions are reported in the second category. In the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported a headcount enrollment increase of 2,952 (1.6 percent), while the proprietary institutions headcount increased by 1,427 (7.3 percent).

Fall 2000 FTE enrollments among all Illinois institutions total 511,455, an increase of 3,535 (0.7 percent) over fall 1999. The FTE enrollment by sector for the last six fall terms is shown below.

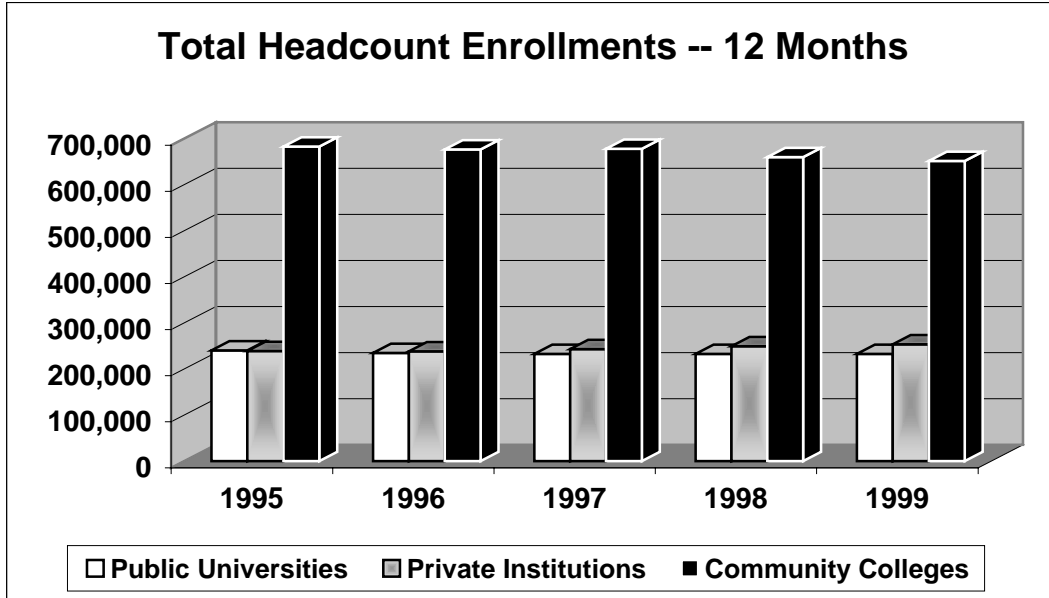

Public universities reported a preliminary FTE enrollment increase of 634 (0.4 percent), while public community colleges reported a decrease of 1,549 (-0.9 percent). Private institutions report a net increase of 4,450 (2.7 percent) in FTE enrollments. Within the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported an increase of 3,373 (2.3 percent) in FTE enrollments. Proprietary institutions reported an increase of 1,077 (6.9 percent) in FTE enrollments.

Total Headcount Enrollments – 12 Months

Another way to examine enrollment trends is to count the total number of people who take courses over an entire year. The 12-month unduplicated headcount shows all students enrolled for credit as well as those in occupational and vocational programs. In the 1998-99 academic year, the most recent year for which information is available, total enrollment in Illinois colleges and universities was 1,135,832, a half percent drop from the previous year. A breakdown shows there were 232,023 students taking courses at public universities; 253,204 at independent institutions; and 650,605 at community colleges.

The following table illustrates the number of students enrolled in Illinois colleges and universities over a 12-month period for fiscal year 1995 through 1999. Data reported do not count the same person twice if they attended in both the fall and spring terms. In 1999, Illinois colleges and universities served 1,135,832 students, a .4 percent decrease from the number served in 1998.

In comparison to the fall 1999 enrollment snapshot, there are an additional 396,689 individuals who attended either during the spring or summer terms. Of the total difference, 78.5 percent of these individuals attend community colleges.
