

GENDER EQUITY IN INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS

Submitted for: Information.

Summary: The attached report is presented in accordance with state statute, which authorizes institutions of higher education in Illinois to grant tuition waivers for the purpose of attaining gender equity in intercollegiate athletics, and requires the Board of Higher Education to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on the use of gender equity tuition waivers and the progress made in achieving gender equity in intercollegiate athletics.

Currently, six universities -- Chicago State University, Eastern Illinois University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University Carbondale, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, and Western Illinois University -- utilize gender equity waivers. These institutions awarded 543 gender equity tuition waivers in fiscal year 2001 with a total value of \$1.4 million.

The use of gender equity tuition waivers has helped Illinois public universities address federal Title IX requirements by providing opportunities for male and female athletes, and by assisting with the equitable distribution of resources among genders. Comparisons to fiscal year 1995, the year prior to the authorization of gender equity waivers, show progress has been made in both the number of females participating in athletic programs (an increase of 56.6 percent) and the resources dedicated to female athletic programs (an increase of 82.3 percent in expenditures).

While progress has been made in addressing issues related to gender equity, there is room for continued improvement. Female students comprise 52.6 percent of full-time undergraduate enrollments, while expenditures for female athletic programs comprise 37.9 percent of total athletic expenditures and 43.7 percent of athletic financial aid is awarded to females.

GENDER EQUITY IN INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS

In 1995, the Illinois General Assembly enacted legislation designed to assist institutions with attaining gender equity in their intercollegiate athletics programs. The law authorizes the issuance of gender equity tuition waivers, and requires the Board of Higher Education to report periodically to the Governor and General Assembly on gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. This is the fourth such report prepared in accordance with this statutory requirement.

The information summarized in this report is not intended, nor should it be used, to determine the level of compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendments Act, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender in any educational program or activity receiving federal financial assistance, including intercollegiate athletics. The United States Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights has established compliance standards and testing procedures for compliance with Title IX and has the sole authority for determining compliance with federal statutes. The information presented in this report should be used only to assess the efforts and accomplishments at Illinois public institutions.

Gender Equity in Intercollegiate Athletics

State statute (110 ILCS 205/9.24) allows public colleges and universities to issue gender equity tuition waivers in amounts not to exceed one percent of all tuition income. These waivers may be granted in addition to any other amount of tuition waivers authorized by the Board of Higher Education. Institutions that issue gender equity tuition waivers do not receive direct funding from the General Assembly for the waivers, but are allowed to waive the required tuition for the student-athlete.

Prior to issuing gender equity tuition waivers, institutions must file a plan for achieving gender equity in intercollegiate athletics with the Board of Higher Education. The plan must include, but not be limited to:

- intercollegiate sports opportunities available to both men and women;
- activities to be undertaken by the institution to achieve gender equity in intercollegiate athletics;
- identification of the barriers to achieving and maintaining equitable intercollegiate athletic opportunities for both men and women;
- progress in achieving sports equity in compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972; and
- the use of tuition waivers for attaining gender equity in intercollegiate sports.

Six public universities – Chicago State University, Eastern Illinois University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University Carbondale, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, and Western Illinois University – have filed with the Board of Higher Education a plan for achieving gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. While Illinois State University and the three campuses of the University of Illinois have intercollegiate athletic programs, the institutions do not grant waivers authorized under 110 ILCS 205/9.24. Neither Governors State University nor Northeastern Illinois University has intercollegiate athletics programs. Northeastern Illinois University maintained an intercollegiate athletics program until June 30, 1998. Appendix A provides updated summaries of the plans submitted and currently on file with the Board of Higher Education.

Tables 1 through 4 summarize data for those institutions issuing tuition waivers for the purpose of achieving gender equity as authorized by the Higher Education Act. Tables 5 through 9 provide participation and expenditure data for intercollegiate athletics by gender. Appendices B and C offer statewide and university-specific detail regarding participation by sport.

Waivers. Tables 1 and 2 show the total value and number of gender equity waivers issued by gender and institution for fiscal years 1996, 2000, and 2001. In fiscal year 2001, six institutions issued 543 gender equity waivers with a value of \$1.4 million. In fiscal year 1996, the first year gender equity waivers were authorized, 77 waivers with a total value of \$189,300 were issued. Gender equity tuition waivers issued to male athletes increased from 42, with a value of \$104,200, to 160, with a value of \$391,700, between fiscal years 1996 and 2001. Gender equity tuition waivers issued to female athletes increased from 35 to 383 during the same time period and the value of these waivers rose from \$85,100 to \$1.0 million. In fiscal year 2001, the value of waivers issued to female student athletes (\$1.0 million) comprised approximately 73 percent of the total value of waivers issued (\$1.4 million).

Tables 3 and 4 present the uses of gender equity tuition waivers by sport, gender, and institution in fiscal years 2000 and 2001. Three institutions issued gender equity waivers to both male and female athletes in fiscal years 2000 and 2001, while three institutions issued gender equity waivers to female student athletes only. The use of gender equity tuition waivers by sport varies by institution.

Intercollegiate Athletics Participation. Table 5 shows participation in intercollegiate athletics by gender for fiscal years 1995, 2000, and 2001. Fiscal year 1995 is included to show the rate of increase from the fiscal year prior to the authorization of gender equity waivers. The number of male students participating in intercollegiate athletics programs increased by 286, or 14.4 percent, between fiscal year 1995 and fiscal year 2001, while the number of female student athletes increased by 587, or 56.6 percent. In fiscal year 2001, a total of 1,624 female student athletes participated in intercollegiate athletic programs. Increases in female student athlete participation rates ranged from an increase of 21.1 percent at the University of Illinois at Chicago to an increase of 139.8 percent at Eastern Illinois University. Rates of participation among male student athletes ranged from a slight decrease of 0.9 percent at Illinois State University to an increase of 70.0 percent at Chicago State University. The percentage increase in the number of female athletes from fiscal year 1995 to fiscal year 2001 outpaced the increase in the number of male athletes at all institutions.

A comparison of male and female participation in intercollegiate athletics with the proportion of undergraduate full-time enrollment is presented in Table 6. In fiscal year 2001, females accounted for 52.6 percent of the undergraduate enrollment and 41.6 percent of all

athletic participation. By comparison, in fiscal year 1995, female students accounted for 50.7 percent of the undergraduate enrollments and 34.2 percent of total athletic participation. Rates of female athletic participation increased at all institutions between fiscal years 1995 and 2001, ranging from an increase of 1.3 (from 38.9 to 40.2 percent) at the University of Illinois at Chicago to 23.9 (from 35.4 to 59.3 percent) at the University of Illinois at Springfield.

Expenditures. Table 7 summarizes expenditures for intercollegiate athletics by gender for fiscal years 1995, 2000, and 2001. Total expenditures between fiscal year 1995 and fiscal year 2001 grew from \$55.5 million to \$83.3 million, an increase of 50.0 percent. During this time, expenditures for female athletes rose from \$10.3 million to \$18.8 million, an increase of \$8.5 million, or 82.3 percent. Expenditures for male intercollegiate athletics grew from \$21.2 million to \$30.7 million, an increase of \$9.5 million, or 44.6 percent, during the same time period.

Table 8 shows comparisons of intercollegiate athletic expenditures by gender with the proportion of full-time undergraduate enrollment. In fiscal year 1995, female student athletes comprised 50.7 percent of the full-time undergraduate student population and expenditures for these female student athletes comprised 32.6 percent of total athletic expenditures by gender. In fiscal year 2001, the proportion of female students to total full-time undergraduate students enrolled rose to 52.6 percent, while the proportion of athletic expenditures allocated to female students rose to 37.9 percent. The proportion of athletic expenditures for female student athletes is up slightly between fiscal years 2000 and 2001 (37.2 to 37.9 percent) while the proportion of female students to total students is down slightly (from 52.7 percent to 52.6 percent).

In fiscal year 2001, the largest disparities between athletic expenditures for females compared to undergraduate enrollments occur at Chicago State University, University of Illinois at Springfield, and Eastern Illinois University. At Chicago State University, females comprised 73.1 percent of undergraduate enrollments while athletic expenditures for female students comprised 50.7 percent of athletic expenditures. However, expenditures for female student athletics at Chicago State University have risen from 42.8 percent of total athletic expenditures in fiscal year 1995 to the current level of 50.7 percent. The smallest differences between female athletic expenditures and percent of student population occur at the University of Illinois at Chicago, Southern Illinois University Carbondale, and Southern Illinois University Edwardsville.

Financial Aid Expenditures. Table 9 compares the percentage of athletic financial aid by gender with the percentage of male and female athletic participants for fiscal years 1995, 2000, and 2001. The proportion of athletic financial aid awarded to females has risen from 37.5 percent of total athletic financial aid in fiscal year 1995 to 43.7 percent in fiscal year 2001. During this same time period, the proportion of females participating in athletic programs has risen from 34.2 percent in fiscal year 1995 to 41.6 percent in fiscal year 2001. Eight of the ten institutions with intercollegiate athletic programs awarded athletic financial aid to females at a rate higher than the percent of athletic participation by females.

Appendix B-1 shows the statewide change in participation by sport and gender between fiscal years 1995 and 2001, and Appendices B-2 through B-4 provide participation detail for each sport by institution. Appendix C provides intercollegiate athletic student aid, expenditures, and gender equity athletic waivers by sport and gender, by campus, for fiscal year 2001.

Conclusions

The use of gender equity tuition waivers has helped Illinois public universities address federal Title IX requirements by providing opportunities for male and female athletes, and by assisting with the equitable distribution of resources among genders. Comparisons to fiscal year 1995, the year prior to the authorization of gender equity waivers, show progress has been made in both the number of females participating in athletic programs (an increase of 56.6 percent) and the resources dedicated to female athletic programs (an increase of 82.7 percent in expenditures).

While progress has been made in addressing the issues of gender equity, there is room for continued improvement. Female students comprise 52.6 percent of full-time undergraduate enrollments, while expenditures for female athletic programs comprise 38.0 percent of total athletic expenditures and 43.7 percent of athletic financial aid is awarded to females.

Appendix A

Summary of Gender Equity Plans

The following is an update for each of the six institutions that have filed a plan with the Illinois Board of Higher Education:

Chicago State University

Intercollegiate sports opportunities available to both men and women. Chicago State University offers a total of 14 intercollegiate sports. Seven of these programs are for men and seven are for women. In fiscal year 2001, a total of 102 men and 89 women participated in these programs.

Activities to be undertaken by the institution to achieve gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. Chicago State University has developed a strong commitment and institutional plan for addressing equity in the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics. It includes the following components: 1) sharing responsibility for compliance on equity issues throughout the institution; 2) establishing a system of sound policies and procedures to help ensure compliance with NCAA equity regulations, those of the Mid-Continent Conference, and those internal to the institution; and 3) systematically auditing and evaluating equity issues to ensure that adequate internal controls are in place. In addition, specific actions to be taken include encouraging walk-ons in women's sports by increasing the number of tuition waivers available, adding women's sports that require a large number of participants either to implement or to augment an existing sport with limited opportunities, and promoting coaching opportunities for women.

Identification of the barriers to achieving and maintaining equitable intercollegiate athletic opportunities for men and women. While Chicago State University has a large undergraduate female population, the majority of these students are non-traditional students and they have little or no interest in participating in sporting activities. In contrast, the majority of the male student population are traditional students and are actively involved in sporting activities.

Progress in achieving sports equity in compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972. Examination over the past three fiscal years indicates that progress has been made in bridging the gender gap in intercollegiate sports participation in both the equal number of sporting activities for men and women (seven) and the increase in the number of women participants. Physical facilities for men's and women's teams are comparable, the budgets for men's and women's teams are comparable, the total recruitment budget for women's athletic teams is greater than for men's teams, a more equitable publicity process for women's teams has been implemented, and there are a number of women in positions of authority as coaches, administrators, and staff members.

The use of tuition waivers for attaining gender equity in intercollegiate sports. Chicago State University provided ten gender equity waivers to female student athletes in fiscal year 2001. These waivers assist the University in increasing the number of athletic opportunities available to women.

Eastern Illinois University

Intercollegiate sports opportunities available to both men and women. Eastern Illinois University offers a total of 22 intercollegiate sports, 11 for men and 11 for women. During fiscal year 2001, 247 females and 367 males participated in these programs.

Activities to be undertaken by the institution to achieve gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. The University continues to assess athletic interests of both females and males through the following activities: surveying the interests of prospective students at a minimum of three University Admissions Office Open Houses per academic year; monitoring athletic programs offered by our feeder schools; and conducting the University's Office of Civil Rights and Diversity surveys of incoming students for athletic interests and abilities. The most recent survey was completed in the summer of 2001. Since the spring of 1998, the University has posted guidelines for proposing new intercollegiate sports on the website and in athletic facilities. The University continues to be committed to allocating funds for athletic financial assistance and operating funds for varsity sports proportional to participation rates. In the summer of 2001, the University committed to funding a full-time staff position for the head coach of women's rugby. The University is committed to promoting rugby as an NCAA emerging sport and continues to provide documentation to the NCAA for encouragement to do so. The University also continues to analyze staffing needs and their assignments of coaching duties annually to ensure that the configuration of coaching staff provides equal opportunities for female and male athletics to receive coaching.

Identification of the barriers to achieving and maintaining equitable intercollegiate athletic opportunities for men and women. Inadequate or limited funding continues to be the primary barrier to achieving equity. Funding limits the availability of additional scholarships.

Progress in achieving sports equity in compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972. Sports equity at Eastern Illinois University is dedicated to fully and effectively accommodate the interests and abilities of the underrepresented gender. The University has enhanced opportunities for women to communicate their athletic interests and abilities to the administration. The University periodically engages in self-studies of the interests and abilities of students to ensure that the athletic program meets Title IX requirements.

The use of tuition waivers for attaining gender equity in intercollegiate sports. The use of tuition waivers for attaining Gender Equity continues to be an integral and critical part of providing proportionally equal amounts of financial assistance to men's and women's athletics teams; without such waivers equity could not be achieved

Northern Illinois University

Intercollegiate sports opportunities available to both men and women. The University offers a total of 17 intercollegiate sports. Eight of the programs are for men and nine are for women. During fiscal year 2001, 158 females and 276 males participated in the athletics programs.

Activities to be undertaken by the institution to achieve gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. Northern Illinois University will maintain the full scholarship allotment for current women's programs. Any new women's programs will be funded through a planned phase-in. The student population will be surveyed for interests every five years. Data will be assessed for potential additions to the program. The University will continue to provide and promote National Girls and Women in Sports Day. Equitable equipment and coaching supplies will continue to be

provided to all men's and women's sports. Parity will be maintained between common men's and women's programs utilizing the same practice and competition facilities. As is done currently, practice times will continue to alternate every other year for the common men's and women's programs. Equitable games management support will continue to be provided for all home events and will be monitored annually to ensure equity. Equitable per diems will continue to be provided for all programs and will be monitored annually to ensure equity. Student-athletes' need for tutoring will be assessed through the Student-Athlete Support Services office and the availability of tutors in high demand disciplines will be increased as needed. When positions become available within the department, experienced females will be recruited to fill them. Assistant coaches' salaries will continue to be paid at an equitable rate and will be monitored annually to ensure equity. Equitable distribution of perks such as memberships and courtesy cars will continue and be monitored annually to ensure equity. Equitable locker room space for men and women's programs will continue to be offered and monitored annually to ensure equity. Athletics training services will continue to be provided for men and women's programs equitably. Assignment of training staff is done annually to ensure equity and distribution of resources is done by need regardless of gender. A video/radio ad was developed by the media services department to highlight the University's commitment to equity and diversity. Continued work on enhancing the media exposure for women's programs is ongoing with media outlets. The importance of women's athletics is being stressed. Quality media guides are available for all sports programs and are reviewed annually to enhance equity. Updated technology will continue to be provided to all our sport programs. The recruiting budget for women's programs has been increased in order to enhance recruiting opportunities.

Identification of barriers to achieving and maintaining equitable intercollegiate athletic opportunities for men and women. The major barrier for Northern Illinois University intercollegiate athletics programs continues to be additional funding to increase opportunities for women without decreasing opportunities for men.

Progress in achieving sports equity in compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendment Act of 1972. The University received written notification from the Office for Civil Rights in October, 2001, stating that Northern Illinois University is no longer under oversight by their organization and is now deemed to be in full compliance with Gender Equity and Title IX.

The use of tuition waivers for attaining gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. Northern Illinois University's use of tuition waivers for achieving gender equity has been, and continues to be, an integral and critical component in its ability to provide equitable financial assistance to its men's and women's sports teams. Our achievement of gender equity and Title IX issues without this assistance would not have been possible.

Western Illinois University

Intercollegiate sports opportunities available to both men and women. Western Illinois University offers a total of 15 intercollegiate sports. Ten of these programs are for men and nine are for women. In fiscal year 2001, 308 males and 167 females participated in these programs.

Activities to be undertaken by the institution to achieve gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. In fall 2001, the University's Intercollegiate Athletics Department developed and implemented an initiative involving 11 specific facility improvement objectives. All but three of these objectives are either specific to women's sports programs or are facilities shared equally by men's and women's sports programs. Tennis courts to be used by both men's and women's tennis programs are currently under construction. Fund raising efforts began in December 2001 to expand and

renovate the women's basketball and volleyball locker rooms. In May 2002, construction is scheduled to begin on the renovation and resurfacing of the outdoor track facility.

Identification of the barriers to achieving and maintaining equitable intercollegiate athletic opportunities for men and women. Scholarship opportunities have been enhanced for both women's and men's teams. The University has continued to provide participation opportunities for men at the current level of sports offerings. Every effort has been made to achieve gender equity without the elimination of men's sports.

Progress in achieving sports equity in compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972. Western Illinois University has been making significant progress toward achieving gender equity. During the 2000-2001 academic year, the University concluded its NCAA Division I Athletic Certification Interim Report. This study provided an additional opportunity to review the institution's gender equity plan and to provide information to the NCAA on specific actions taken by the institution to address gender equity in its intercollegiate athletics program. After review by the NCAA Division I Committee on Athletics Certification, the committee reaffirmed the University's first-cycle certification status of "Certified."

The use of tuition waivers for attaining gender equity in intercollegiate sports. The University began utilizing gender equity tuition waivers in the 1996-1997 academic year to fund increased female participation efforts. The number and distribution of these waivers continues to enhance efforts to increase participation opportunities for female student athletes and provide more equitable and adequate budget support for women's sports programs in accordance with Title IX while providing non-discriminatory opportunities for both sexes. The additional tuition waivers have allowed the University to add women's soccer in the fall of 1997 and women's golf in the fall of 2001. The addition of women's golf has increased the number of participant opportunities for women.

Southern Illinois University Carbondale

Intercollegiate sports opportunities available to both men and women. Southern Illinois University Carbondale offers a total of 14 sports in its intercollegiate athletics program—seven for men and seven for women. During fiscal year 2001, 273 men and 169 women participated in intercollegiate sports.

Activities to be undertaken by the institution to achieve gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. The University continues to strive to achieve gender equity in accordance with Title IX guidelines. The assessment of Title IX compliance is an ongoing process that requires constant evaluation of the opportunities, scholarship and treatment afforded to student athletes of both genders. The gender equity plan adopted in 1998 as part of the University's participation in the NCAA Division I Certification process will continue to be reviewed and updated. The University will provide an interim status report to the NCAA regarding progress toward gender equity as well as other certification goals in fiscal year 2003.

Identification of the barriers to achieving and maintaining equitable intercollegiate athletic opportunities for men and women. Funding continues to be the primary barrier to achieving gender equity. Perceptual barriers to increasing opportunities for women appear to be easing as men's and women's sports become more fully integrated into a united athletics program.

Progress in achieving sports equity in compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972. Several steps have been taken since the submission of the last gender equity plan to

improve compliance with Title IX. Two staffing issues have been addressed for women's basketball to make staffing comparable to that available for men's basketball. First, a full-time secretary was hired for the women's basketball program during fiscal year 2001. Second, a position in women's basketball was increased from a graduate assistantship to a full-time position effective for fiscal year 2002. In addition, the University has committed to the building of a softball stadium, with construction beginning in the summer of 2002 and a targeted completion date of February 2003. The University entered into a Voluntary Resolution Agreement with the Office of Civil Rights on February 12, 2001, regarding construction of the softball facilities. The construction of the softball stadium will address equity issues between the softball and baseball teams in terms of access to playing and practice facilities and related amenities, locker rooms, batting cages, and laundry facilities for uniforms and practice gear. The University is studying the feasibility of adding a financial incentive to its roster management efforts to hold men's participation steady and increase women's participation. If implemented, the financial incentive would further encourage coaches of women's teams to add numbers to their rosters by providing additional budgetary support for equipment, athletic apparel and travel expenses.

The use of tuition waivers for attaining gender equity in intercollegiate sports. During fiscal year 2001, the University allocated 128 gender equity scholarships to women. Use of these tuition waivers continues to enhance the University's efforts to improve participation opportunities, scholarships, and treatment available to female student athletes.

Southern Illinois University Edwardsville

Intercollegiate sports opportunities available to both men and women. During fiscal year 2001, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville offered a total of 13 intercollegiate sports--six for men and seven for women. During fiscal year 2001, 125 males and 110 females participated in intercollegiate sports.

Activities to be undertaken by the institution to achieve gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. In 1995, the University approved a gender equity plan for achieving compliance with Title IX. Since the plan's inception, women's volleyball and golf have been instituted; all other women's sports have received additional operational resources to encourage full rosters and additional scholarship resources to improve the number of opportunities. Women's participation levels have increased and the percent of expenditures in operations and scholarships for women have experienced significant growth.

Identification of the barriers to achieving and maintaining equitable intercollegiate athletic opportunities for men and women. The University has identified the greater number of playing opportunities involved in men's baseball and wrestling as a potential problem for achieving a 58/42 ratio. The additional on-campus housing and increase of traditional undergraduate population also are impacting the balance in opportunities.

Progress in achieving sports equity in compliance with Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972. The University has made significant progress toward achieving gender equity in intercollegiate athletics in accordance with Title IX. New programs in women's sports have been added, scholarship and financial support has improved, and participation levels have increased. Interest surveys are conducted on a recurring basis. Equity studies are conducted annually by the gender equity committee. Plans and recommendations have been put into place to address future equity initiatives.

The use of tuition waivers for attaining gender equity in intercollegiate sports. Southern Illinois University Edwardsville awarded five gender equity waivers in fiscal year 1996. In fiscal year 2001, 51 waivers were awarded to female student athletes and ten were awarded to male student athletes. The gender equity committee recently recommended greater use of the gender equity waivers to encourage further growth in women's sports and to implement proposed new programs.
