

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2006 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

Submitted for: Information.

Summary: This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2006 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. The report also summarizes 12-month headcount enrollments and enrollments in remedial/developmental courses during the 2004-2005 academic year.

Fall 2006 preliminary headcount enrollments at 203 degree-granting institutions total 806,945, while preliminary FTE enrollments total 584,627. Excluding enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois, preliminary headcount enrollments total 800,352, an increase of 0.1 percent from fall 2005, and preliminary FTE enrollments total 578,285, an increase of 0.9 percent from fall 2005.

**PRELIMINARY FALL 2006 ENROLLMENTS IN
ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION**

This report summarizes preliminary fall-term 2006 headcount and full-time-equivalent (FTE) enrollments at colleges and universities in Illinois. It also includes 12-month unduplicated headcount enrollments and information on enrollments in remedial/developmental courses for academic year 2004-2005. Final fall-term headcount enrollments, aggregated by student characteristics such as gender, racial/ethnic group, class level, and declared major, are obtained during the winter and are published each spring in the *Data Book on Illinois Higher Education*. Fall-term enrollments provide a “snapshot” of Illinois higher education enrollments on the 10th day of the fall term. Twelve-month unduplicated headcount enrollments report the number of individuals who attend colleges and universities over the course of the full year.

Preliminary Fall 2006 Enrollments By Sector

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2006 preliminary headcount enrollments at 203 degree-granting institutions total 806,945 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, preliminary headcount enrollments total 800,352, representing an increase of 0.1 percent from fall 2005. Headcount enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown below in Table 1.

Public universities reported a preliminary headcount enrollment increase of 471 (0.2 percent) between fall 2005 and 2006, while public community colleges reported a headcount decrease of -2,532 (0.7 percent). Independent institutions (excluding out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois) reported a headcount increase of 3,239 (1.3 percent). Institutions in the independent sector are subdivided into two general categories in the attached detailed report of institutional enrollments (Table 8): not-for-profit and for-profit. Not-for-profit institutions reported a headcount enrollment increase of 2,910 (1.4 percent), while the proprietary institutions reported an increased of 329 (1.0 percent).

Including enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois, fall 2006 full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollments total 584,627 (see Table 8). When enrollments at out-of-state institutions operating in Illinois are excluded, fall 2006 FTE enrollments total 578,285, an increase of 5,023 (0.9 percent) over fall 2005. Undergraduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing the number of undergraduate credit hours by 15; graduate fall FTE enrollment is calculated by dividing graduate credit hours by 12. FTE enrollments by sector for the last five fall terms are shown in Table 2.

Public universities reported a preliminary FTE enrollment increase of 421 (0.2 percent), while community colleges reported a decrease of -531 (0.3 percent). Independent institutions reported a net increase of 5,133 (2.6 percent) in FTE enrollments. Within the independent sector, not-for-profit institutions reported an increase of 4,684 (2.6 percent) in FTE enrollments, while proprietary institutions reported an increase of 449 (1.9 percent).

Preliminary Fall 2006 Enrollments By Level

Table 3 reports fall 2006 preliminary headcount enrollments by level, showing undergraduate headcount at 663,762 and graduate headcount at 136,590. Total undergraduate enrollment grew by 0.0 percent in fall 2006 while total graduate enrollment grew by 0.8 percent. Not included in Table 3 are undergraduate headcount enrollments at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois totaling 4,162 and graduate headcount enrollments totaling 2,444.

Table 4 presents fall 2006 preliminary FTE enrollments by level, showing undergraduate FTE enrollments at 478,416 and graduate FTE enrollments at 99,869. Total undergraduate FTE grew 0.7 percent in fall 2006, while total graduate FTE grew by 1.5 percent. Not included in Table 4 are undergraduate FTE enrollments totaling 4,061 and graduate FTE enrollments totaling 2,229 at out-of-state institutions authorized to operate in Illinois.

Ratio of FTE Enrollment to Headcount

The ratio of FTE enrollment to headcount enrollment is a measure of the proportion of students that are enrolled full time. As illustrated in the table below, this ratio increased slightly in fall 2006 for all three sectors.

Total 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount

Twelve-month unduplicated headcount includes all students enrolled for credit from July 1 to June 30 of the following year (or from September 1 to August 31 of the following year). Total Illinois enrollment in the 2004-2005 academic year, the most recent for which information is available, was 1,238,454, a 0.1 percent increase over the number served in 2004. A breakdown by sector shows there were 234,534 students attending public universities; 304,949 at independent institutions; and 698,971 at community colleges.

Table 6 illustrates the number of students enrolled in Illinois colleges and universities over a 12-month period for academic years 2001 through 2005. Data are unduplicated, they do not count the same person twice if he or she attended the same college and university in both the fall and spring terms. A person may be counted two or more times, however, if he or she attended more than one institution or campus during the same year.

Comparing twelve-month 2004-2005 enrollment to fall 2004 enrollment, an additional 436,906 individuals across all sectors enrolled during the spring 2005 or summer 2005 terms but not in the fall 2004 term. Students enrolled at community colleges accounted for 76.9 percent of this total incremental difference (335,767).

A significant number of Illinois community college students also enroll in non-credit courses. According to data collected by the Illinois Community College Board, in academic year 2004-2005, Illinois community colleges served 258,080 unduplicated, non-credit headcount students. When combined with credit-course enrollments, total community college system enrollment was over one million students in 2004-2005. Data on non-credit course enrollments are not available for public universities or independent institutions.

**Total Remedial/Developmental Students
Within 12-Month Unduplicated Headcount**

The following table summarizes unduplicated headcount of students enrolled in at least one remedial/developmental course during a 12-month period (academic year 2004-2005). Many students simultaneously enroll in college-level coursework and one or more remedial/developmental courses. Such students are included in these data. Detailed remedial/development course enrollment data are presented in Table 9.
