FISCAL YEAR 2015 GOVERNOR'S HIGHER EDUCATION BUDGET OPERATIONS, GRANTS, AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Summary: On March 26, 2014, Governor Quinn released his proposed state

operating and capital budgets for Fiscal Year 2015. This item

summarizes the Governor's proposals for higher education.

STATE OF ILLINOIS BOARD OF HIGHER EDUCATION

FISCAL YEAR 2015 GOVERNOR'S HIGHER EDUCATION BUDGET OPERATIONS, GRANTS, AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Overview of the Governor's Proposed Fiscal Year 2015 State Budget

The Governor's recommended fiscal year 2015 budget is both a continuation of the previous five-year focus on responsible fiscal management and the first step in a new fiver-year fiscal stabilization plan. This budget provides a "five-year blueprint to secure Illinois's financial future" based on the following objectives:

- > Increased employment,
- > Increased investment in education,
- > Tax relief for homeowners and working families,
- > Continue Medicaid transformation,
- > Continue rebalancing to community-base care,
- Eliminate bill backlog to less than 30 day payment cycle, and
- Restrain state spending and ensure stable, predictable state finances.

The Governor's proposal is based on general fund revenues of \$38.6 billion, which assumes continuation of the current income tax structure. The budget proposal provides tax relief for homeowners and working families through a \$500 yearly property tax refund and doubling of the Earned Income Tax Credit. The Governor's budget recommendation also focuses on providing stable, predictable state finances; avoiding extreme cuts to education and critical services; continuing to pay down the backlog of unpaid bills; and continuing efficiencies and fiscal disciplines. The budget maintains level funding for state and local governments, while providing more funding for Illinois' schools, early childhood education, and student financial aid. Over the long term, the Governor is proposing continued spending restraint by imposing GRF spending camps and creating an enhanced "rainy day" fund to prepare for unanticipated economic events.

The Governor's proposed FY 2015 all-funds budget totals \$65.9 billion, an increase of \$1.5 billion, or 2.4 percent, over FY 2014. The Governor's proposed FY 2015 general funds budget totals \$32.2 billion, an increase of \$1.1 billion, or 3.5 percent, over FY 2014 general funds appropriations.

In keeping with statutory requirements that require the Governor to present a budget based on current revenues, the budget proposal also presents a "not recommended" fiscal year 2015 budget. The budget assumes the current income tax is allowed to expire on January 1, 2015 and the individual income tax rate declines from 5.0 percent to 3.75 percent while corporate tax rates decline from 7.0 percent to 5.25 percent. Under this scenario, the decline in state spending would result in drastic spending cuts to government programs and services, including a \$247.9 million, 12.5 percent, cut to higher education.

Governor's Proposed Fiscal Year 2015 General Funds Budget for Higher Education Operations and Grants

The Governor's FY 2015 budget includes \$2.0 billion in state general funds support for higher education operations and grants, an increase of \$52.7 million, or 2.6 percent, over FY 2014 levels. With the exception of an additional \$50.0 million for MAP, the Governor's proposed budget is reflective of the IBHE Step One level, at which higher education is funded at the current FY 2014 appropriation. The Governor's FY 2015 budget proposal reflects the *Illinois Public Agenda* goals of affordability and support for core activities. The Governor's proposed budget also incorporates IBHE's performance based funding recommendations from public universities and community colleges.

- **Public Universities:** The Governor's budget includes \$1.23 billion in state general funds support for public universities, which is level with the FY 2014 appropriation. By campus, the proposed funding levels for public universities are based on the reallocation of \$6.16 million based on the performance funding recommendations adopted by the Board of Higher Education. (Tables 5 and 6)
- Community Colleges: The Governor's budget cuts \$4.1 million, or 1.4 percent, including reductions of \$3.5 million to the Alternative Schools Network and elimination of Veterans' Grants Reimbursements of \$750,000. The budget includes the reallocation of \$360,000 for performance funding, and provides for implementation of the Illinois Longitudinal Database System (ILDS). (Tables 7 and 8)
- Adult Education/Postsecondary Career and Technical Education: The Governor's FY 2015 budget includes \$51.3 million for adult education and career and technical education grants, the same level of support provided in FY 2014. (Table 9)
- Illinois Student Assistance Commission: The Governor's budget includes \$441.0 million for ISAC programs. The Governor's budget provides \$423.2 million for the Monetary Award Program (MAP), which is an increase of \$50.0 million over FY 2014. This additional funding will help meet student costs and further the goals of the *Illinois Public Agenda*. The ISAC budget also includes new funding for agency state administration (\$3.0 million), outreach and training (\$2.3 million), and College Illinois! Marketing (\$1.0 million). The increase in state funding will partially offset a decrease in federal revenues available to ISAC. (Table 10)
- **Institutional Grants and Special Initiatives:** The Governor's FY 2015 budget appropriates a total of \$7.2 million for institutional grants, the same level of support provided in FY 2014. (Table 11)
- University Center of Lake County (UCLC): The Governor's FY 2015 budget provides \$1.2 million, which is level with the FY 2014 appropriation, for operations at the University Center of Lake County. (Table 12)
- Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy (IMSA): The Governor's FY 2015 budget for IMSA is \$18.4 million, which is level with the FY 2014 appropriation. (Table 13)
- **Higher Education Agencies:** The Governor's FY 2015 budget includes an additional \$22,800 for the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) of which \$20,000 is allocated towards the increase in dues to the Midwest Higher Education Compact. The budget

includes level funding for general operating costs at the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB). The State Universities Civil Service System (SUCSS) receives an increase of \$87,700. (Tables 14 and 15)

• **Retirement:** The Governor's budget proposal provides \$1.5 billion for the State Universities Retirement System (SURS), which reflects the actuarially determined requirement. This level of funding reflects an increase of \$34.4 million, or 2.3 percent, over FY 2014. The Community College Retirees Health Insurance Program is funded at \$4.5 million. (Table 16)

Governor's Proposed Fiscal Year 2015 Budget for Higher Education Capital Improvements

The Governor's FY 2014 capital budget plan pledges continued support for the \$31 billion *Illinois Jobs Now!* capital program that was approved by the General Assembly in 2009. This program is well underway, and since FY 2010, the state has released funding for critical infrastructure projects that improve schools, repair roadways and bridges, and renovate and construct state facilities. The Governor's FY 2014 budget proposal supports over \$474.0 million in continuing re-appropriations for *Illinois Jobs Now!* higher education projects that have not been released, or that have only received partial funding. These projects include renovation and construction projects and deferred maintenance at public universities and community colleges. The Governor's FY 2015 capital budget plan does not propose any new funding for higher education capital projects. (Table 17)
