RE: Addendum to the 2003 Report on Underrepresented Groups

At the June 3, 2003 meeting, the Board considered the annual Report to the Governor and General Assembly on Underrepresented Groups in Illinois Higher Education. This report is mandated by Public Act 85-283 and contains information about policies, practices, and trends in the participation in higher education of underrepresented groups, that is, minority, disabled, and female students and staff. During the Board's discussion of the reports, Chairman Kaplan asked staff to prepare supplementary material to the information in the report on students with disabilities.

Specifically, Chairman Kaplan requested revisions to Table 25 that would show the unduplicated total of students with disabilities at each public university receiving institutional services. In the table included in the original report, two institutions provided a duplicated count for their total enrollment. Table 25 also includes a change from the published report in the percentage of enrollment that students with disabilities represent at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. The correct percentage is 1.4 percent and not 0.8 percent as previously indicated. This recalculation also affects the percentage that students with disabilities represent of total enrollment at all Illinois public universities. This now rises from 1.6 percent to the corrected 2.0 percent included in the revised table. Mr. Kaplan also requested a table that would show changes from the previous year in the number of students with disabilities enrolled or receiving institutional services at community colleges and public universities. This information is attached, presented as an addendum to Tables 24 and 25 of the report considered in June.

In addition to this information on students with disabilities, this mailing also includes a revised Table 2 on community college enrollment. The 2003 Board report on underrepresented groups contained errors in the annual totals and the percent change in total enrollment for each race/ethnic group. The attached revised table provides the corrected information.
