


A COMPARATIVE PROFILE OF ILLINOIS HIGHER EDUCATION

As shown in the following sector comparisons, Illinois colleges and universities serve a more ethnically/racially diverse group of undergraduate students than their out-of-state peers.




Index of Diversity: the likelihood that two undergraduate students randomly selected from the sample will belong to a different racial/ethnic group.

Illinois public universities serve higher proportions of Asian American, Latinx, and African American undergraduate students when compared to out-of-state peer institutions.




Illinois community colleges serve substantially more African American undergraduate students than their out-of-state peer institutions (26% to 6%).



Not-for-Profit private colleges in Illinois serve higher proportions of Asian American and African American undergraduate students when compared to out-of-state peer institutions in the same sector.



For-Profit private colleges in Illinois serve higher proportions of African American and Asian American students; however, they serve a lower proportion of Latinx undergraduate students when compared to out-of-state peers (25% to 30%).
