# **REALTOR<sup>®</sup> University**

REALTOR<sup>®</sup> University ceased operations as an independent institution of higher education in the State of Illinois on December 31, 2020.

## **Institutional History**

REALTOR<sup>®</sup> University (RU or the University) was a private not-for-profit institution offering a Master of Real Estate degree in the Chicago Region. The University operated and awarded degrees from 2012 through 2020. The University was located in downtown Chicago at 430 North Michigan Avenue - the REALTOR<sup>®</sup> Building of the National Association REALTOR<sup>®</sup>.

In 2020, it was announced that the National Association of REALTORS<sup>®</sup> had entered a partnership with Columbia College of Columbia Missouri to create the NAR Academy at Columbia College. With the graduation of all active Master of Real Estate program students, and with the sharing of the curriculum with Columbia College, REALTOR<sup>®</sup> University discontinued its master's program and ceased operations. REALTOR<sup>®</sup> University alumni will become members of the Columbia College Alumni Association.
