First year students at GSU do not declare a major. They are all enrolled as General Studies students until completion of their first semester their sophomore year, at which time they declare their major. They are placed into Focus Areas based on their intended major (https://www.govst.edu/GeneralEducationAdvising/ and https://catalog.govst.edu/content.php?catoid=13&navoid=1492). Advising guides identify the specific courses within the General Education areas of Communications, Humanities and Fine Arts, Mathematics, Physical and Life Sciences, and Social and Behavioral Sciences that are specific for the intended majors. GSU Admission requirement is a 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, and SAP minimum is 2.0. Some programs have specific GPA requirements beyond SAP requirements, to be admitted, but application to the programs does not occur until first semester sophomore year.
