
Introduction of Institution Preparedness Survey

Preliminary Results from Survey & Discussion

Survey Respondents


Of survey respondents:

- 93% (n=64) were aware of PA 99-46 reporting requirement (Preventing Sexual Violence in Higher Education Act)
- 81% (n=56) were aware of survey requirement under PA 102-0325 (for which the base survey this task force recommends will be used)
- 23% (n=16) had previously conducted a sexual misconduct climate survey




Among institutions that have conducted a sexual misconduct campus climate survey previously

Total Institution Responses

■ Annually ■ Biennially ■ Every 3 years ■ Every 4 Years ■ NA/Other


- 69% of institutions conducted the survey in the spring semester
- 75% (n=12) used an institution-designed survey [while 2 used ARC3, 1 used AAU, and 1 used HEDS]



Institutional Capacity to Conduct Survey


- **58%** (n=40) had an office dedicated to survey research
- **51%** (n=35) felt they had staff capacity to conduct the survey
- **75%** (n=52) felt they had technological capability to conduct the survey
- **88%** (n=61) felt they had capacity to confidentially store data
- **65%** (n=45) felt they had capacity to analyze and summarize survey results
- **62%** (n=43) felt they had capacity to offer some kind of incentive

Level of Preparedness to Conduct SMCC Survey



Readiness to Meet Students' Needs

- **90%** (N=62) had a counseling center on campus
- **97%** (n=67) had an established sexual misconduct reporting procedure
- **81%** (n=56) had reporting procedure posted in highly visible locations

Most Common Answers:

- Federal and State Survey Requirements Need to Align
- Survey Frequency
 - Capacity to implement change
 - Survey fatigue concerns for students
- Low Response Rates

Most Common Issues:

- Definition of Terms and Question Wording
- Low Response Rates

If your institution has not conducted a survey of this type previously, what questions or concerns do you have about this pending requirement?

Most Common Concerns:

- Resources
 - Including, staffing and costs
- Federal and State Survey Requirements
- Low Response Rates
- Diversity and Accessibility

Most Common Concerns:

- Publishing of Data,
 - Identification of Students
- Survey Frequency and Fatigue
