

Illinois is **best in the nation** for completion rates at four-year institutions among all community college students (part-time and full-time).






Illinois is **fourth in the nation** for overall degree completion among full-time community college students.

Minnesota (N = 4,974)	82.3%
South Dakota (N = 865)	76.6%
North Dakota (N=750)	75.5%
Illinois (N=11,334)	73.5%
U.S. Overall	60.8%




Illinois is **third in the nation** in completion rates for **adult learners** at public universities and not-for-profit private colleges.






Illinois public colleges **substantially outpace** the national averages in terms of six-year completion rates.





The **overwhelming majority of full-time students** at Illinois not-for-profit private colleges and public universities complete a degree within six-years.








Private Not-for-Profit Colleges: 87.7%




Illinois also has the **highest**percentage of full-time

National Average: 18.4%






Most undergraduate students served by IL institutions, particularly the public colleges, are Illinoisans.






ILLINOIS COLLEGES ARE MORE DIVERSE THAN THEIR OUT-OF-STATE PEER INSTITUTIONS

Proportion of Undergraduate Students Identified as Traditionally Underrepresented




Index of Diversity

Illinois Higher Education Landscape

- 12 public universities 181,810 students in 2018-19
- 48 community colleges 282,180 students in 2018-19
- 110 independent institutions 271,235 students in 2018-19
 - 65 institutions are "grandfathered" from many IBHE requirements
- 39 out-of-state institutions 8,936 students in 2018-19
- 243 private business and vocational schools approximately 44,000 students annually
- 97 public and independent institutions approved to provide online degree programs as part of the voluntary national State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA)
- 31 public and independent universities approved to offer dual credit programs (in addition to 48 community colleges)



Higher Education Regulation

- The Triad
 - State higher education agencies (IBHE)
 - U.S. Department of Education
 - Accrediting bodies
- State authorization is the gateway for degree-granting institutions.
 - Operate and advertise in Illinois
 - Accreditation
 - Access to Title IV federal financial aid and veterans education funds
 - Access to Illinois MAP funds
- State authorization is the gateway for private business and vocational schools.
 - Operate and advertise in Illinois
 - Accreditation (optional)
 - Access to federal veterans education and workforce training funds

Change

- Student population increasingly diverse
 - About 40%, nationally, are 25 years of age or older
 - Over 60%, nationally, work full- or part-time
 - Over 1 M adults in Illinois with some college/no degree
- Improve supports to help more students be successful in credit-bearing courses
- Calls to make recognition of learning more portable across settings
 - Recognition of work-based learning for college credit
 - Micro-credentials
 - A new generation of transcript the comprehensive learner record
- Pathways that incorporate industry-recognized credentials
- More flexible, personalized instructional models competency-based education
- New providers coding boot camps
- Institutional changes of control
 - Mergers, acquisitions, and partnerships
- Institutional closures
 - 40 closures in Illinois since 2016
