

Board of Regents Constitutional Responsibilities

- A. Planning, coordination, and budgetary responsibility
- B. Additional powers
 - Approve, disapprove, revise or eliminate existing degree programs, departments or divisions of instruction
 - Study & report to the legislature: creating a new institution; merging institutions; creating new management boards; and/or transferring institutions from one management board to another
 - Develop & revise a Master Plan, including a funding formula
 - Require submission of budgets from all institutions & in turn submit the budget for all higher education as well as priorities for capital outlay
- C. Other powers as provided by law



Management Board Constitutional Responsibilities



All authority of supervision & management not specifically vested to the Board of Regents are reserved for management boards.

For example:

- Appoint campus presidents
- Receive & expend appropriated funds
- Purchase, sell and lease land
- Confer degrees
- Oversee personnel decisions
- Set by-laws and rules governing the board and the campuses
- Provide fiduciary, strategic, and generative leadership




UL System Board of Supervisors

- 16-Member Board
 - 15 appointed by the Governor for 6-year terms (two members per Congressional District and three members at large)
 - 1 student member selected by UL System SGA Presidents each May
- Standing Board Committees
 - Academic and Student Affairs
 - Athletic
 - Executive
 - Facilities Planning
 - Finance
 - Grievance
 - Legislation
 - Personnel
 - Ad Hoc Committees, i.e., Committee on Pandemic Operations

Statewide Enrollment Trends






UL System Students
