
Harper Has Helped Shape Our Region

- 40 degree programs and 100 certificate programs






Changing Demographics — 2009

Equity Gaps

The College's equity gaps were reviewed at the beginning of the FY2021-2024 Strategic Plan. In examining the data, the most pressing gaps are present for Black and Latinx students in three areas:

- Gateway Course Success (4-yr average baseline)
 - Black student success rate in 0-15 courses is 56.3%, White student success rate is 71.4%, a 15.1% gap.
 - Latinx student success rate in 0-15 courses is 62.7%, White student success rate is 71.4%, an 8.7% gap.
- Fall-to-Fall Persistence rate (4-yr average baseline)
 - ^o Black student rate (full-time) is 56.1%, White student rate (full-time) is 75.2%, a 19.2% gap.
 - Black student rate (part-time) is 43.9%, White student rate (part-time) is 54.6%, a 10.7% gap.
- Graduation rate (4-yr average baseline)
 - ^o Black student rate is 13.1%, White student rate is 34.9%, a 21.9% gap.
 - Latinx student rate is 27.8%, White student rate is 34.9%, a 7.1% gap.



The Promise Program offers tuition earned to every eligible incoming public high school student in Harper's district. Currently, nearly 500 students are in the program.

 The Igniting Paths to Success scholarship awards full tuition, fees and books to nearly 900 students

 the majority of which are historically underrepresented students.

 More than 11,000 students were awarded \$26 million in scholarships, grants and tuition waivers in 2020-2021. Harper student reinventing herself via Career Exploration course, Igniting Paths scholarship This past fall, Arnetta took her first two courses in Harper's <u>Phlebotomy</u>
