IBHE has issued the fall 2017 Enrollment Report. It provides a "snapshot" of Illinois higher education enrollments on the 10th day, or census date, of the fall term.

#### Illinois has 197 degree-granting institutions with degree granting authority from IBHE. Preliminary figures for fall 2017 find:

- Total headcounts: just over 764,000
- Total full-time equivalent (FTE) Enrollments: just under 570,000
- Community colleges accounted for slightly less than half (48%) of the undergraduate enrollment based on headcount and 37% of undergraduate FTE enrollment.
- Public universities accounted for 22% of undergraduate headcount enrollment and over a quarter (27%) of all undergraduate FTE enrollment.

The Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE), working in partnership with the Illinois Network of Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies (INCCRRA), has received a planning grant from the Robert R. McCormick Foundation. This planning grant is for the purpose of advancing the efforts to enhance the preparation and professional development of early childhood educators in Illinois through an aligned credentialing system called **Illinois Gateways**. Through the planning period of calendar year 2018, IBHE and INCCRRA will work with multiple state agencies, institutions of higher education, and other early childhood education stakeholders to design a competency-based assessment system aligned with the state's Illinois Gateways credentials for the field. National experts in competency-based education and assessment will be part of the design work and support IBHE and INCCRRA in engaging stakeholders to develop the plans. This planning work will serve as a model for other Illinois workforce development and career pathway efforts.


The Robert R. McCormick Foundation has long included Illinois Gateways as a focus area for creating a pipeline of qualified, effective, and diverse early childhood educators in Illinois. These credentials provide a competency-based pathway to initial employment; associate-, baccalaureate-, and master's-level degrees; as well as opportunities to specialize in areas such as Infant/Toddler work and leadership of early childhood programs. This competency-based pathway, inclusive of the Illinois Gateways credentials, is described in the policy brief, "Advancing the Illinois Early Childhood Education Workforce: A Model College and Career Pathway."
