

Spring 2016 Enrollment Snapshot

This report is a 2016 spring enrollment snapshot from the public universities that included information for last two academic years. To better establish enrollment patterns, this information was combined with fall enrollment numbers collected via IBHE's Fall Enrollment Survey (FES) I.

As shown in *Table 1*, total enrollment at the Illinois public universities was flat, evidencing no significant total changes in number of students being served at the twelve public universities.

Undergraduate Enrollment (based on FTE)

The fall to spring decrease was the same in both years (a 7% decline) in comparing fall and spring undergraduate enrollment in 2014-15 to fall and spring undergraduate enrollment in 2015-16. The decrease in enrollment from fall to spring can be explained by a combination of students stopping/dropping out of college (not being retained) and students graduating at the end of the fall semester.

As shown in *Table 2*, undergraduate enrollment at Illinois public universities was fairly stable in comparing both fall of 2014-15 to fall of 2015-16 (-550 FTE or-0.4%), as well as spring of 2014-15 to spring of 2015-16 (-839 FTE or -0.7%). However, there was quite a bit of variation between the public universities: undergraduate enrollment growth occurred at the University of Illinois at Chicago, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Declines of at least 5% in undergraduate enrollment were experienced at Chicago State University, Eastern Illinois University, and Western Illinois University.

Graduate Enrollment (based on FTE)

Illinois public universities experienced a slight increase in graduate enrollment in comparing fall of 2014-15 to fall of 2015-16 (+506 FTE or 1.3%) and spring of 2014-15 to spring of 2015-16 (+701 FTE or 1.8%). Governors State University, the University of Illinois at Chicago, the University of Illinois at Springfield, the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and Eastern Illinois University experienced graduate enrollment growth. Southern Illinois University Carbondale, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Northern Illinois University, and Illinois State University experienced graduate enrollment declines during the same timeframe.
