### FISCAL YEAR 2020 REPORT ON PUBLIC UNIVERSITY TUITION AND FEE WAIVERS AND Tuition Quartiles

### Introduction

IBHE annually collects information from Illinois public universities on the amount and value of tuition waivers granted by student level, type of waiver (mandatory or discretionary), and specific waiver program.

Beginning in 2020, a new requirement was added that IBHE collect and include data pertaining to the percentage of out-of-pocket tuition and fees paid by students each year. Consistent with the Board's focus on equity, we have shown the impact on students by socio-economic status and race.

### **Background on Waivers**

In order to pay for college costs, many students rely on various types of financial aid programs including tuition and fee waivers, a type of institutional financial aid that exempts students from paying a portion (or all) tuition and fee charges. Tuition and fee waivers are typically awarded at the undergraduate level to students with special talents and/or special financial needs. Graduate-level tuition and fee waivers are typically awarded to students serving as teaching or research assistants.

Waivers serve multiple purposes: they provide access to higher education programs, promote scholarships, provide a recruitment tool, provide employee benefits, and enhance the educational environment by promoting a diverse student body. All Illinois public university waivers fall into one of two categories, mandatory or discretionary. Mandatory waivers are authorized and required by state statute. Discretionary waivers are determined at the institutional level. and used by universities to provide access to higher education for students who possess specific academic or athletic talents and for special status students, such as out-of-state and foreign students.

The Standard Tuition and Fee Waiver Chart of Accounts, attached as Appendix B to this report, provides a complete description of each waiver category.

### **Tuition Quartiles**

This section details the amount of tuition and fees paid by undergraduate students in recent years. When collecting this data, institutions were instructed to provide the headcount of students based on the percentage of tuition and fees paid in the following five ranges:

Percentage Range of Tuition and Fees Paid
0%
1% - 25%
26% - 50%
51% - 75%
76% - 100%


The tuition and fees costs calculated reflect the amount of tuition and fees students paid (including from loans and work study) after all scholarships, grants, and other financial assistance have been applied to the students' tuition charge.

### **Findings**

In Fiscal Year 2020, of the 134,124 undergraduate students reported, 60,626 (45.2%) paid at least 76% of their tuition and fees, while 36,838 (27.5%) paid zero. The percentage of students paying at least 76% of tuition

and fees has decreased from 48.6% in Fiscal Year 2018, while the percentage of students that paid nothing has increased from 24% in the same span.

Residency. When examining the data by residency, in-state students followed similar trends to the totals mentioned above, but out-of-state students varied significantly. In Fiscal Year 2020, 41.8% of in-state students paid at least 76% of their tuition and fees, while 70% of out-of-state students fell into the same range. 29.8% of in-state students paid at least zero percent of their tuition and fees, while only 10.8% of out-of-state students did the same. Nearly half of all in-state undergraduates paid less than 50% of their 2020 tuition and fees balance. Figures 1 and 2 display the differences in the percentages of students in each category for residents versus non-residents.



Socio-Economic Status. In Fiscal Year 2020, among students eligible for the Pell grant, 57.2% paid zero percent of their tuition and fees, an increase from 49.2% in 2018. Conversely, only 7.9% of Pell eligible students were reported to have paid at least 76% of their tuition and fees in Fiscal Year 2020. This is a decline from 11.4% in 2018. The data suggests that the financial challenges for low-income students are increasing over time.

In Fiscal Year 2020, more than half of White and Asian undergraduate students paid at least 76% of their tuition and fees. African American and Latinx students were both below 30% in this category. Conversely, less than 22% of both White and Asian students paid none of their tuition and fees, while 39.2% of Hispanic students paid zero, as well as nearly half of reported African American students (49.7%). In nearly every racial category, the percentage of students paying 76% or more of their tuition and fees has declined over the past two years, while the percent of students paying zero has increased.<sup>1</sup>




Figure 4: 2020 Undergraduate Students Paying Tuition and Fees by Race by Percentage Quartiles

### **Tuition Waivers**

### **Summary Findings**


Figure 6 displays the proportion of waiver dollars dedicated to each category. Graduate discretionary waivers accounted for more than 50% of the total at NIU and SIUC, and over 80% at UIC, and UIUC. The smallest category for every institution is graduate mandatory waivers, where it accounts for less than 10% at every university except for CSU and GSU.

In Fiscal Year 2020, public universities issued a total of 41,595 waivers at a value of \$478.5 million, compared with 41,398 waivers at a value of \$467.8 million in Fiscal Year 2019. Graduate student waivers account for the majority of waivers granted at Illinois public universities, with most of these being graduate teaching/research assistants. Figure 6 provides the total number of recipients and dollar values of mandatory and discretionary waivers granted at both the undergraduate and graduate levels for Fiscal Year 2020. Fiscal year 2019 values are also included for comparison purposes. Detailed data by institution for Fiscal Year 2020 are included in Appendix A.

Total waiver value from every university can be seen in Figure 7 below. Of the total \$478.5 million in waivers for Fiscal Year 2020, UIUC is responsible for about half with \$246.5 million. CSU is responsible for the least amount of waiver dollars with only about \$1.9 million.

### **Military Personnel Waivers**

The report includes the number of recipients and value for the unfunded or waived portion of the Illinois Veteran Grant, Illinois National Guard Grant, and MIA/POW Scholarship Program tuition and fee waivers that were not reimbursed to the institution by the State. In the past, the State reimbursed the institutions for most of the cost of this waiver. In total, Illinois public universities waived approximately \$20.3 million in tuition and fees during Fiscal Year 2020 for eligible military veterans that were not reimbursed by the state. This is a decrease of about \$1.3 million, or 6.2 %, from the \$21.7 million reported in Fiscal Year 2019.

The following table illustrates the economic impact of Veterans and National Guard scholarships on Illinois public colleges and universities. Waivers can be used for either undergraduate or graduate studies. While military grants are invaluable in helping our veterans pursue a higher education degree, universities and community colleges do not receive funding to cover the costs of these grants resulting in a reduction in the amount of tuition income revenues available to institutions. This appears to impact Southern Illinois University Carbondale and Western Illinois University the most, representing more than 3% of their tuition and fee revenues.

### **Undergraduate Waivers**

The total value of undergraduate waivers decreased by 0.2 percent, from \$116.3 million in Fiscal Year 2019 to approximately \$116.1 million in Fiscal Year 2020. Undergraduate waivers accounted for 24.3% of the total value of all public university tuition and fee waivers in Fiscal Year 2020.

In Fiscal Year 2020, of the \$116.1 million in total undergraduate waivers, approximately \$46.9 million (40.4 percent) were mandatory and \$69.2 million (59.6 percent) were discretionary. The largest mandatory waiver program, Veteran Grants and Scholarships, totaled \$14.6 million, or 31% of the value of undergraduate mandatory waivers in Fiscal Year 2020.

Of the \$69.2 million in discretionary waivers awarded in Fiscal Year 2020, \$28.5 million, or 41.1 percent, were awarded to students with athletic, academic, or other talents. Foreign Exchange waivers totaled \$11.1 million (16 percent), Student Need waivers totaled \$15.4 million 22.3 percent), Gender Equity waivers totaled \$8.7 million (12.5 percent), and Civil Service waivers totaled approximately \$2 million (2.9 percent).

### **Graduate Waivers**

Graduate students play an integral role in the educational missions of Illinois public universities and serve the universities in providing enrichment of academic programs and supporting academic operations. Graduate students serve as instructors and teaching assistants for undergraduate course sections and provide valuable research assistance to faculty, which enriches the educational environment for both students and faculty. These waivers further enable Illinois public universities to remain competitive in attracting the best graduate students.

Graduate waivers accounted for 75.7% of the value of all public university waivers in Fiscal Year 2020. Graduate assistant waivers, which consists primarily of waivers for graduate, teaching, and research assistantships, accounted for 71% of the value of all public university graduate tuition and fee waivers granted in Fiscal Year 2020.

Public universities awarded graduate waivers to 22,564 recipients totaling \$362.4 million in Fiscal Year 2020. Of the total, approximately 97.6 percent, or \$353.8 million, were for discretionary waivers, and of those, graduate assistant waivers totaled \$251.2 million. From Fiscal Year 2019 to Fiscal Year 2020, the value of graduate tuition and fee waivers increased, from \$351.5 million to \$362.4 million, which is an increase of about 3.1 percent.

- **1.1 Mandatory Waivers:** Tuition and fee waivers authorized by legislation that requiresuniversities to grant to eligible students.
  - 1.2 Teachers Scholarships: Special Education Grants (110 ILCS 947/65.15): Provides tuition and necessary fee awards to encourage current teachers and academically talented students to pursue careers in any area of special education as a public or private elementary or secondary school teacher in Illinois. Recipients are exempt from paying tuition and fees at an eligible institution for up to four years.

Purpose: To provide financial incentives to pursue special education teacher training.

Goals: To increase the number of certified special education teachers.

Eligibility and Criteria: Participants must be a United States citizen or an eligible non-citizen; an Illinois resident; agree to take courses to prepare for the teaching of handicapped children or children with learning disabilities; be an Illinois high school graduate and rank in the upper half of the graduating class, or hold a valid teaching certificate that is not in the discipline of special education; and not have received a waiverunder this program in the past. Participants are required to contract with the Illinois State Scholarship Commission and teach special education for two years within the 5-year period following graduation.

1.3 General Assembly Scholarships (105 ILCS 5/30-9): Each member of the General Assembly may grant, annually, two four-year scholarships, one for the University of Illinois, and the other for any state-supported university, to persons from his/her district. The scholarships exempt the holder from paying tuition or fees, with the exception of fees for book rental, service, laboratory, supply, union building, hospital and medical insurance, and any fees pledged for the payment of interest and principal on bonds for the operation and maintenance of buildings.

**Purpose**: To extend opportunities for attending the University of Illinois or other state-supported universities.

Goals: To promote scholarship, and provide incentives for students living in a legislator's district.

**Eligibility and Criteria**: Students must live in the nominating legislator's district and are required to sign a waiver of confidentiality concerning scholarship information.

This program has been phased out and only remaining waivers for this program are those that were previously issued.

1.4 Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) Scholarships (105 ILCS 5/30-16): Scholarships are offered to residents of Illinois whose scholastic standing enables them to enroll in ROTC programs. The scholarships exempt the holder from paying tuition or fees, with the exception of fees for book rental, service, laboratory, supply, union building, hospital and medical insurance, and any fees pledged for the payment of interest and principal on bonds for the operation and maintenance of buildings.

**Purpose:** The General Assembly declared that it is essential for the national defense and for the defense of the state of Illinois that among those residents of this State receiving higher education, provisions should be made for Reserve Officer's Training Corps training. In order to provide officers for the several Armed Forces of the United States of America, scholarships should be furnished to eligible residents, in order to encourage their participation in the Reserve Officer's Training Corps programs.

Goals: To increase the participation of students in the Reserve Officer's Training Corps programs.

**Eligibility and Criteria:** Residents of the State of Illinois whose scholastic standing willenable them to enrol in the Reserve Officer's Training Corp programs available at universities supported by the state of Illinois. Applicants are required to take an examination each year according to rules prescribed by the presidents, or designees, of participating institutions. Scholarships are awarded on a merit basis to those eligible recipients receiving the highest grades with evidence of leadership ability. Applicants also must submit to

the institution Selective Service registration compliance documentation. Waivers shall be awarded at each university on the basis of the equivalent of 10 scholarships per class, per branch of service, each academic year to eligible recipients.

1.5 Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) Scholarships and Fee Waiver (20 ILCS 505/8): DCFS annually selects 48 children, at least four of whom are children of veterans, for scholarship and fee waivers for four consecutive years at any university or college maintained by the state of Illinois. Selection is based on scholastic record, aptitude, and general interest in higher education.

**Purpose:** To give financial assistance for college expenses to selected children under the care of the Department.

**Goals:** To provide educational incentives to children under the care of the Department with an interest and aptitude for higher education.

**Eligibility and Criteria:** The Department may select 48 students under their care, at least four of whom must be children of veterans, on the basis of scholastic record, aptitude, and interest in higher education, and who have completed four years of high school.

1.6 Partial Tuition Waivers for Children of University Employees (110 ILCS 305/7f, 660/5-90, 665/10-91, 670/15-90, 675/20-91, 680/25-91, 685/30-90, and 690/35- 90): Public university governing boards must offer fifty percent tuition waivers for undergraduate education to the children of employees who have been employed by the granting university and/or any public university in Illinois for an aggregate of at least seven years. Participants must be under the age of 25 and qualify for admission to the university.

**Purpose:** To grant partial tuition waivers to the children of employees to attend the university. **Goals:** To provide financial incentives for the children of employees to attend the university and to provide an employee benefit for the faculty and staff of state supported universities. **Eligibility and Criteria:** The parent or guardian of the waiver recipient must have been employed by any public university for at least seven years. Children receiving the waiversmust be undergraduates under age 25 at the commencement of the academic year the waivertakes effect, must qualify for admission, and can only receive a maximum of four years of partial tuition waiver benefits.

1.7 Senior Citizen Courses Act (110 ILCS 990): Permits senior citizens, over the age of 65, to enroll in regularly scheduled credit courses at public institutions of higher education without payment of tuition. Does not include payment of fees. Limited to persons whose annual income is less than the threshold amount in the Senior Citizens and Disabled Persons Property Tax Relief and Pharmaceutical Assistance Act.

**Purpose:** To provide tuition free credit courses for senior citizens that attend public institutions of higher education in Illinois.

**Goals:** To provide opportunities for financially disadvantaged senior citizens to enroll in courses in higher education.

**Eligibility and Criteria:** Must be age 65 or older with an annual household income belowthe threshold amount of the Senior Citizens and Disabled Persons Property Tax Relief and Pharmaceutical Assistance Act.

1.8 Honorary Scholarships (110 ILCS 305/9): Each county is entitled, annually, to one four-year honorary scholarship at the University of Illinois for children of persons who served in the armed forces of the United States during the periods of hostility specified in statute. Preference is given to children of such persons deceased or disabled. Does not include payment of fees.

**Purpose:** To provide four-year scholarships to the children of veterans of the armed forceswho served during a period of hostility.

Goals: To provide an educational benefit for the children of veterans.

**Eligibility and Criteria:** Each Illinois county is entitled to award one scholarship to the University of Illinois. Preference is given to the children of deceased or disabled veterans. Recipients must have attained proficiency in the courses usually taught in secondary schools, be of good moral character, be older than 15 years of age, and qualify for admission to the university.

- **2.1 Discretionary Waivers:** Tuition and fee waivers determined by legislation or university policy that may be awarded at the discretion of the institution.
  - **2.2** Faculty/Staff Waivers: Tuition and fee waivers awarded to university faculty, staff, or other employees or their dependents. Includes tuition and fee waivers given to other university employees or agencies as a condition of employment or through reciprocal agreements.

**Purpose:** To provide educational benefits to the employees of the university, theirdependents and employees of other institutions or agencies with reciprocal agreements.

**Goals:** To reward employee service, and increase employee retention through free orreduced-cost educational benefits.

**Eligibility and Criteria:** Must be a member of the university faculty or administrative staff or an employee covered by the State Universities Civil Service System.

- **2.2.1 Faculty/Administrators**: Waivers granted to faculty and administrative staff of the university. Does not include civil service employees under the State Universities Civil Service System.
- **2.2.2 Civil Service Staff: University Employees:** Tuition waivers recommended by the University Civil Service Merit Board and adopted by public university governing boards for tuition charges for their own university employeescovered under the State Universities Civil Service System. These waivers are excluded from the Board of Higher Education's tuition waiver limitation.
- **2.2.3 Civil Service Staff: Interinstitutional/Related Agencies:** Tuition waivers granted at the discretion of the University or through reciprocal agreements for employees of other institutions or agencies whose positions are considered equivalent to positions of the university and who are under the State Universities Civil Service System. These waivers are excluded from the Board of Higher Education's tuition waiver limitation.
- **2.2.4 Retired University Employees:** Waivers granted at the discretion of the University to retired university employees.
- **2.2.5 Children of Deceased Employees:** Waivers granted at the discretion of the University to dependents of deceased university employees.
- 2.3 Student Talent/Merit Waivers: Tuition and fee waivers awarded to students based on student talent in a particular field, academic merit, or special status such as minority students, foreign exchange students, out-of-state students, or academically disadvantaged students.

**Purpose:** To provide financial assistance to students with academic talent or special status. **Goals:** To attract academically talented students to the institution and to increase student diversity by encouraging students with special talents or standing to attend the institution. **Eligibility and Criteria:** Based on academic record, other academic talent, or special status.

**2.3.1** Academic/Other Talent: Waivers granted to students based on their enrollment and abilities in a particular academic program or activity or students belonging to underrepresented groups. This includes waivers granted to student government leaders, student members of debate

teams, music or theater groups, orminority students.

- **2.3.2** Athletic Waivers: Waivers granted to students who are part of an institution's intercollegiate athletic program, including athletes, trainers, and assistants. This category would include full or partial waivers for the non-residentportion of tuition for out-of-state recipients, but does not include waivers issued to achieve gender equity in intercollegiate athletics pursuant to 110 ILCS 205/9.24.
- **2.3.3 Gender Equity in Intercollegiate Athletics (110 ILCS 205/9.24):** Publicuniversity governing boards may grant tuition waivers, in an amount not to exceed one percent of all tuition income, for the purpose of attaining gender equity in intercollegiate athletics. Waivers may be granted only for those sports sanctioned by the National Collegiate Athletic Association or the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. These waivers are excluded from the Board of Higher Education's tuition waiver limitation.
- **2.3.4 Foreign Exchange Students:** This category should only be used as part of an exchange program where students are enrolled in a foreign university and enroll in an Illinois university by paying tuition at the foreign university or paying the Illinois resident rate. In these cases, the difference between the foreign studenttuition rate and the Illinois resident tuition rate should be included as a foreign exchange student waiver. In cases where a foreign student receives a waiver for the full tuition amount in exchange for providing a service to the university, such as a teaching or research assistant, the entire waiver should be reported as a studentservice waiver. Foreign exchange student waivers are excluded from the Board of Higher Education's tuition waiver limitation.
- 2.3.5 Out-of-State-Students: Waivers granted to students whose home of record is outside Illinois, but within the United States of America at the time of first admission to the university. This category includes both full tuition and fee waivers and waivers for the difference between residential tuition rates and non- residential rates. These waivers should be valued at the difference between the actual amount of tuition and fees paid by the student and the established out-of- state tuition and fee rate. Waivers to out-of-state students receiving full or partialwaivers in other categories, for example athletic or talent waivers should not be reported here.
- **2.3.6 Foreign Students:** Waivers granted to students whose official home of record for the purpose of determining tuition and fee charges is outside the United States of America. This category includes both full tuition and fee waivers and waivers for the difference between residential tuition rates and non-residential rates. These waivers should be valued at the difference between the actual amount of tuition and fees paid by the student and the established tuition and fee rate for foreign students. Waivers for foreign students receiving full or partial waivers in other categories, for example athletic or talent waivers should not be reported here.
- **2.3.7 Fellowships**: Waivers granted to students who also are receiving afellowship for which no service is required.
- 2.4 Student Need Waivers: Tuition and fee waivers granted to studentsdemonstrating financial need.

Purpose: To provide financial assistance to students who demonstrate financial need or hardship.

**Goals:** To attract academically talented students to the institutions who otherwise would be prohibited from attending due to cost.

**Eligibility and Criteria:** Recipients must demonstrate financial need and/or be enrolled in special academic programs or other university activities.

- **2.4.1 Financial Aid Waivers:** Tuition and Fee waivers awarded by the university through the financial aid office for students demonstrating financial need.
- **2.4.2 Special Program Waivers**: Tuition and fee waivers awarded to economically disadvantaged students based on enrollment or participation inspecial academic programs or other university activities.
- **2.5 Student Service Waivers:** Tuition and fee waivers granted to students to support the university mission, goals, and objectives through participation in outside contracts; graduate or undergraduate research, teaching, or other assignments; training or grant programs; external internship programs; clinical portions of degree programs conducted at other institutions; or other student experiences.

**Purpose:** To provide educational benefits and financial incentives to students.

Goals: To provide students with valuable educational experiences.

**Eligibility and Criteria**: Recipients must be enrolled in the university or under contract, and, for the educational experiences and benefits, agree to perform related services.

- **2.5.1 Cooperating Professionals:** Waivers granted to outside professionals who cooperate with the university or supervise clinical experiences for university students. Includes local elementary and secondary school district personal that work with student teachers, librarians, health care professionals, industrial relations field supervisors, and social welfare supervisors.
- **2.5.2 Research Assistants:** Waivers granted to graduate or undergraduate students that have a research assignment with the university for an academic term, including waivers for summer sessions.
- **2.5.3 Teaching Assistants:** Waivers granted to graduate or undergraduate students that have a teaching assignment with the university for an academic term, including waivers for summer sessions.
- **2.5.4** Other Assistants: Waivers granted to graduate or undergraduate studentsthat have an assignment, other than research or teaching, with a university for an academic term, including waivers for summer sessions.
- **2.5.5 Contract/Training Grants:** Tuition and fee waivers awarded to students as a condition for receiving funds for an outside grant program. Includes waivers for students participating in federally funded programs at the university or for tuition for required courses necessary for participation in outside internship programs. (No waiver should be recognized when student charges are paid from an outside funding source.)
