Assistant Project Director
(Grant Funded)**

- Changes in the nature of work are accelerating
- Innovative disrupters to traditional postsecondary education are growing
- Budget challenges are exacerbated

We are looking for an **Assistant Project Director** to assist in the development of the Early Childhood Access Consortium for Equity, one of the strategic plan strategies. IBHE, state agencies, and public two- and four-year institutions of higher education are launching a statewide consortium of institutions to make coursework available for members of the incumbent early childhood care and education workforce. The Consortium will ensure courses are offered when and where students need, with program delivery and student support services that are specifically targeted to meet the needs of working adults. The ideal candidate will possess:

- A passion for public service and education
- Experience in the field of early childhood care and education and related workforce development, systems, and policy issues

- Knowledge of higher education administration or experience working with initiatives involving multiple institutional partners
- Experience in working on large projects from inception through completion
- Good verbal and written communication and interpersonal skills

Major Duties and Responsibilities

- Assists the Project Director in the successful establishment of the structure, governance, and operations of the Consortium and timely progress toward Consortium goals.
- Coordinates communication with representatives from other Illinois state agencies included on the Steering Committee.
- Conducts research as needed to inform the Project Director and other stakeholders of best practices and successful precedents with regard to higher education consortia nationally and internationally.
- Updates work plan at the direction of the Project Director to ensure timely progress towards achieving Consortium goals.
- Coordinates the grantmaking process for Consortium-related activities from disbursement of funds to collection of reports.
- Assists in the preparation of reports for the General Assembly, the Governor, and the Advisory Committee on the progress made by the consortium.

Education and Experience

- Bachelor's or Master's degree in public administration, higher education, or a related field; at least two or more years of relevant experience working in an education field.
- Knowledge and experience in the field of early childhood care and education and/or higher education.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- Commitment to public service and passion for education
- Excellent interpersonal skills, with a strong focus on collaboration and teamwork
- Demonstrated ability to work with a variety of constituents and stakeholders, such as Board members, senior government executives, elected officials, institutional officers and leaders, private sector leaders, and community-based partners.
- Excellent problem-solving and written and verbal communication skills.
- Strong project management skills.

Work Location

Work locations are Chicago, IL and Springfield, IL, with the possibility of some remote work. Travel within Illinois is expected, as required by the work.

Salary

Salary is commensurate with experience. We offer the state's competitive employee benefits package. **This is a temporary grant-funded position with a term of up to three (3) years.**

Applicants should have no expectation that this position will be funded once the grant term ends.
